The above languages are particularly relevant this week in reference to our Cultural Diversity Day celebrations and I feel so proud of our school and what we have achieved. Our cultural diversity is what makes Victory Primary School such a unique and special school and the 60 flags that surrounded the perimeter of the hall this week represent all of the nationalities, regions, and cultures that make up our school and community.

Our hall looked incredible on Wednesday with a range of culturally inspired art works as part of our Ngā Hau e Whā exhibition. Directly translated, 'ngā hau e whā' means 'the four winds' and it's a reference to people coming to Victory Primary School from the North, South, East, and West. The collaborative floral artwork by Room 18 summed it up perfectly by using the quote "At our school we are all different but we grow together", which links directly to our school value of Kotahitanga (partnership, collaboration, and togetherness). Our tamariki had the chance to try new things and eat together while learning about different cultures at the same time. Our friends from Ngāti Rārua also came to the party by providing a cultural inspired lunch menu for the week. All in all it was a great chance for our kids to feel proud of their own identity while appreciating and valuing the many cultures that make us who we are at VPS.


